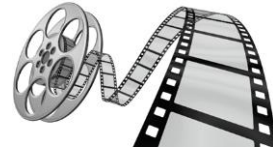


Conservation Film Series

May 11: "The Messenger" A beautiful movie with fantastic close-up footage of birds in flight that tells the story of song birds that travel across the globe, carrying messages about environmental health.

June 8: "Flight of the Butterflies" Follow the most incredible migration on Earth as two generations of butterflies migrate north and a Super Generation finds its way home to Mexican mountaintops where they have never been.

July 13: "Trees in Trouble" How does a city respond to an imminent tree crisis caused by invasive insects such as the emerald ash borer? View an arresting demonstration of the importance of trees for their health, the health of nature and, ultimately, of our cities.

August 10: "A Fierce Green Fire" the first big-picture exploration of the environmental movement. How have fifty years of grassroots and global activism shaped policies from conservation to climate change? Hear vivid stories about people fighting - and succeeding - against enormous odds.

September 14 "Greenfire" Explores the life and legacy of famed conservationist Aldo Leopold (A Sand County Almanac). Learn how he promoted wilderness protection, ecological restoration, and consciousness about living on a piece of land while keeping its ecosystem intact.
